

Prior SAC meeting Minutes Review & Approval

Mrs. Keane motioned to approve the minutes of the December 14, 2022 meeting, and Mrs. Berry seconded the motion.

<u>Thornton - School Improvement Plan - Science</u>

Thornton reviewed the SIP Science needs analysis. Cape View's three-year trend in science data reflects a decline of ten percentage points from (59%) 2019 to (49%) 2022. The 2022 science data on FSA is above the state (48%) but below the district (55%), 35% of Cape View's fifth grade students earned a 60% or better on SSA Part 1 for August 2022. Ms. Wedel shared that SSA part 2 opens in February and we have until March to get it completed; our goal is to have more than 35% to make a 60% or higher on the assessment, the target is 55%.

Mrs. Keane explained that penda is an online program that pushes out lessons, and the amount of material to cover is too much for a teacher to cover in a 30-minute period. Also, she shared that teachers analyze their science data to inform instruction; the Title I team monitors data as well.

Mrs. Keane is scheduled to cover for administration at Cambridge Elementary on January 19th, during her time there she will meet with Title I teachers, science/lab teachers to discuss their science data and how they found success with their students. Mrs. Keane will speak to this at cape View's February 8 SAC meeting.

Mrs. Thornton - PBIS

Ms. Thornton shared that Cape View went from a Gold to Platinum status this school year she referenced this success to Cape View's PBIS Team.
