


1. Students receive a link to the Zoom meeting via Outlook email, Microsoft Teams, Google Classroom, or Focus Teacher Webpage.




2. Students click the link and are prompted to enter their name. Use **First name** and **Last initial**. Make sure to check "Remember my name for future meetings"
