SpeakOut Hotline is designed to help you anonymously report any threatening behavior or situation that endangers you, your friends, family, community, or your school campus. Reporting isn't "snitching," reporting is when you need to keep yourself or someone you know safe from threats, harmful behaviors, or dangerous situations.

By guaranteeing a caller's anonymity, SpeakOut allows the caller to give information without the fear of retribution.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and schools' officials.






Please consider the following before seeing a counselor for a schedule change:

Florida Kid Care: Millions of Florida children from birth through the 19th birthday count on Florida KidCare for affordable, high-quality health and dental insurance. With year-round enrollment, the time to apply for Florida KidCare is <u>anytime</u>, and it's easy and free to apply! Apply online at <u>www.FloridaKidCare.org</u> or by calling 1-888-540-KIDS (5437).

Seniors: Members of the Class of 2024 should order graduation caps and gowns at www.Jostens.com as soon as possible, but no later than January 31. Gowns should be hung immediately to allow wrinkles to smooth.

Student Parking: All students who drive to school must display a 2023–2024 parking hang tag either by their rearview mirror or on their dashboard. To buy a hang tag, students should bring a valid driver's license, vehicle registration, and \$20 cash (no bill larger than a \$20 bill) to Ms. Desjardins in the Media Center before school, after school, or during lunch. **Students who park on campus without a parking hang tag will receive a \$5 fine that will be charged to their Obligations list**. After three tickets, students will be referred to the dean.

Free/Reduced Lunch: The Free and Reduced Lunch Application for the 2023-24 school year is now available in several different languages! For your convenience, the Free and Reduced Price Lunch application may be completed online from a computer, tablet, or mobile device by clicking here: Free/Reduced Lunch Application (Note that students with Free/Reduced Lunch will also be eligible for fee waivers for weekend SAT and ACT tests).

Early Dismissal Reminders - BPS Board Policy 5230 relates to the early dismissal of students. As has been stated in the THS Student Handbook for many years, please be aware of the following procedures for student check out.

Emergency Check Out - The emergency contacts you provided during registration are **only** for emergencies. This means that if an emergency occurs and the custodial parent/legal guardian is **NOT** able to check out the student, the Attendance Clerk will contact the custodial parent/legal guardian to verify that the student may be released to an emergency contact. The emergency contact must present valid identification to check out the student. Students will **NOT** be released to individuals not listed on the emergency contact list; please update this information if necessary.

Non-Emergency Check Out - For the safety of our students, only the custodial parent/legal guardian may check out students. As stated in the Student Handbook for the past several years, if a parent/legal guardian cannot check out a student, students must bring a doctor, court, or parent note that includes the date, time, phone number of parent/guardian, the emergency contact who will check out the student, or which grants permission for students who walk/drive to leave. Students should give the note to the Attendance Clerk by 9am (or upon arrival at school). The clerk will call the parent/guardian to verify the request. Without a written note, only the parent/legal guardian will be permitted to check out the student.

If your phone numbers/email address have changed or you need to add emergency contacts, please contact the Front Office by Friday, November 17 to update your information.

Attendance Reminder - Off Campus Students: All RAISE tutor and EFSC students that are off campus are not to enter campus until their assigned THS class begins. When off campus students arrive to THS, they are to enter through attendance, show their ID to the attendance clerk, and go straight to class. Off campus students who are just arriving to THS should NOT scan the kiosk with their ID. All tardies that were logged from the start of school for off campus students have been cleared out and removed from the attendance portal in Focus.

ID Badge Policy: Students must always <u>wear</u> their ID badges while on campus. Every student will receive an ID Badge and lanyard at registration. Students who lose their ID Badge will have to purchase a new one through the Attendance Office for \$5.00.

Student Dress Code: Hats can be worn <u>outdoors only</u>. Shirts must be worn at all times. Undergarments must not be exposed. Chest, midriff, and back should be covered at all times. Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are crude; vulgar/profane; violent/death-oriented; gang related; sexually suggestive; and/or promote alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy:

- Students may use cell phones before school, after school, during their assigned lunch, and during class changes.
- Cell phones **must be turned off and out of sight during class times**, which are indicated by the late bells and dismissal bells.

Students are prohibited from using cell phones during class time.
