SpeakOut Hotline is designed to help you anonymously report any threatening behavior or situation that endangers you, your friends, family, community, or your school campus. Reporting isn't "snitching," reporting is when you need to keep yourself or someone you know safe from threats, harmful behaviors, or dangerous situations.

By guaranteeing a caller's anonymity, SpeakOut allows the caller to give information without the fear of retribution.

FortifyFL (App) https://getfortifyfl.com/

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and schools' officials.


Testing Update: The current test window has closed. The new testing window will start November 27th!



***PLEASE remember that purchasing a yearbook ad page does <u>NOT</u> include purchasing the actual yearbook so be sure to order a book as well. This can be done on the same website https://www.yearbookforever.com. Price is currently \$75 and will go up in January to \$85.

Josten's: Juniors and seniors recently received information about class rings, other jewelry, graduation invitations, caps and gowns, and specially priced packages. MIMPORTANT: The deadline for seniors to order senior swag from Josten's is December 1! Orders may be placed at www.Jostens.com. Extra materials, including ring sizers, from Friday's meeting are available in the Front Office.

Student Parking: All students who drive to school must display a 2023–2024 parking hang tag either by their rearview mirror or on their dashboard. To buy a hang tag, students should bring a valid driver's license, vehicle registration, and \$20 cash (no bill larger than a \$20 bill) to Ms. Desjardins in the Media Center before school, after school, or during lunch. **Students who park on campus without a parking hang tag will receive a \$5 fine that will be charged to their Obligations list**. After three tickets, students will be referred to the dean.

Free/Reduced Lunch: The Free and Reduced Lunch Application for the 2023-24 school year is now available in several different languages! For your convenience, the Free and Reduced Price Lunch application may be completed online from a computer, tablet, or mobile device by clicking here: Free/Reduced Lunch Application (Note that students with Free/Reduced Lunch will also be eligible for fee waivers for weekend SAT and ACT tests).

Attendance Reminder - Off Campus Students: All RAISE tutor and EFSC students that are off campus are to not enter campus until their assigned THS class begins. When off campus students arrive to THS, they are to enter through attendance, show their ID to the attendance clerk, and go straight to class. Off campus students who are just arriving to THS are to NOT scan the kiosk with their ID. This will solve the tardy issue. All tardies that were logged from start of school for off campus students have been cleared out and removed from attendance portal in Focus.

Impact Forms: The federal impact forms have gone Virtual! Please log into your FOCUS account and fill out the Federal Impact Survey for your student. The deadline to complete this is October 19, 2023.

ID Badge Policy: Students must always <u>wear</u> their ID badges while on campus. Every student will receive an ID Badge and lanyard at registration. Students who lose their ID Badge will have to purchase a new one through the Attendance Office for \$5.00.

Student Dress Code: Hats can be worn outdoors only. Shirts must be worn at all times. Undergarments must not be exposed. Chest, midriff, and back should be covered at all times. Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are crude; vulgar/profane; violent/death-oriented; gang related; sexually suggestive; and/or promote alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy:





Important Tips & Reminders

On Campus Ad submission DEADLINE is Mon. Oct. 9, rm 10-163
 ONLINE ADS: You have the option of designing your own ad online for a small service fee. Go to YEARBOOKFOREVER.COM.
 *Deadline for online submission is Wed. Nov. 1. Online ad designing may begin after Sept. 1, 2022. There are approximately 7 different templates for each ad size.

DO NOT SUBMIT: Powerpoint, Publisher or Word files

- <u>Best way</u> to get questions answered regarding ads is via email: benson.aimee@brevardschools.org
- Do NOT submit CUT photos (special shapes).
- If you choose to print your own digital photos, they must be on GLOSSY photo paper.
- If you submit your pictures or entire ad <u>digitally</u>, it must be on a CD or flash drive, in jpeg, tiff or pdf file format and the files must be at least 200 ppi/ resolution. (If that makes NO sense, <u>don't</u> try it)!
- The more photos you put in your ad the less room you will have for writing, and vice-versa.
- If you stick your photos together with glue or tape, they will be submitted as they are.
- You may submit a suggested layout for your ad but it is NOT required, we can design to fit your materials.
- NO profanity is allowed in ad writing.
- NO illegal/immoral activities should be described in the adwriting or depicted in the photos.
- Ad materials shall NOT contain any pictures or writings that are defamatory towards individuals, ethnic groups, or religions.
- If you use a QUOTE or song LYRICS, etc., in your ad, you must give credit to the source/writer.

Failure to follow any directions on this form could lead to your ad being rejected and returned to you.

Maximum Amount of Photos Allowed per AD Size

Full = 10 pictures

1/2 = 5 pictures

1/4 = 3 pictures

it must be submitted as a single digital file.

Ad Submission Info

Ad submission should include: **your payment in FULL**, your photos, and all writings. **ONLY** businesses may pay with a check...students & parents buying on campus must use CASH **(NO BILLS LARGER THAN A 20)**. Please have everything TOGETHER in a **sealed envelope** or **ziploc** bag so nothing gets lost. Please include **contact information** with your ad materials just in case we need to contact you about something.

Please **DON'T** send in any **original/irreplaceable** photos because there is a chance you won't get them back. Photos may be picked up in **MAY** when <u>yearbook distribution</u> occurs.
