Different Types of Dual Enrollment Opportunities at Astronaut High School

- On campus dual enrollment includes our health science dual enrollment courses: Intro to Healthcare, Medical Terminology and Patient Care (seniors only). An unweighted 2.5 GPA is required for Intro to HC and Medical Terminology and an ACT, SAT or PERT test must be completed but there are no minimum score requirements. The application process, including orientation, must be completed prior to the semester these classes begin.
- 2. **Part-time dual enrollment** classes are off campus at EFSC: A 3.0 GPA is required and College Readiness Scores must be attained in Reading and English (Writing) on the ACT, SAT or PERT. The application process, including orientation, must be completed prior to the semester these classes begin.
 - 1 release period = 1 dual enrollment classes
 - 2 release periods = 2 dual enrollment classes
 - 3 release periods = 3 dual enrollment classes
- 3. **Full-time dual enrollment (seniors only)** Full-time classes at EFSC during 2nd semester only: An unweighted 3.0 GPA is required; the application process, including orientation, must be completed prior to the semester these classes begin.
 - Only for 2nd semester seniors, No classes at the high school, 4-5 dual enrollment classes
 - Must have all required high school subject-area credits completed except 1 credit each in English, Math, Science and Social Studies
 - Meet the minimum 'college-ready' score in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. Scores must be no more than 2 years prior to starting classes, SAT/ACT scores must be on file at EFSC.
- 4. Early Admission (seniors only) Full-time classes at EFSC the entire senior year: An unweighted 3.0 GPA is required The application packet for Early Admission must be completed by the deadline or the senior will not be considered for Early Admission. Packets are usually available for pick up by late February.
 - Only for Seniors, No classes at the high school, 4-5 dual enrollment classes each semester
 - Must have all required high school subject-area credits completed except 1 credit each in English, Math, Science and Social Studies
 - Meet the minimum 'college-ready' score in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. Scores must be no more than 2 years prior to starting classes, SAT/ACT scores must be on file at EFSC.
- 5. **Collegiate High School** Classes are off campus at EFSC: an unweighted 3.0 GPA is required and 'college-ready' scores must be attained in Reading and English (Writing) on the ACT, SAT or PERT and earned in Math by the end of the junior year.
 - Must attend a Collegiate HS Orientation in 9th or 10th grade and continue on a path to reach an A.A. degree. Failing a required course for the A.A. or dropping below the GPA requirement is reason for dismissal from Collegiate High School.
 - Only Collegiate High School dual enrolled students are eligible for bus transportation to EFSC for 3rd and 4th periods.
 - Collegiate HS students stay on the AHS campus during 3rd and 4th periods on Friday's
