- ❖ Brevard's Choice Schools Lottery is run on *Monday, December 12th, 2022*
- ❖ Seat Acceptance Deadline is *Friday, January 27th, 2023*
- ❖ Waitlist Applications will be Open *Monday, April 10th – Friday, July 21st, 2023*
- ❖ Last Day for Schools to Offer a Seat is *Wednesday, July 26th, 2023*

Registration Information for the 2023-24 School year has not yet been announced by the district. As soon as we can give parents answers, emails will be sent out to our incoming families. Please make sure you check your email and Family Dashboard frequently, (including your spam folder), as this is how we send out most information.

- Once school ends for 2022-23, please make sure you have a copy of your student's final report card, the third administration of the FAST and all End of Course Exams (EOC) taken at time of enrollment.
- Seventh graders will need an updated immunization form to include the Tdap booster before July 1, 2023.

Home School and Private School Students

All grade levels must attain a minimum 45th percentile score in each area on a National Norm-Referenced Student Achievement Test. Some Private Schools will administer this at the school. However, you can also contact your zoned school and request your student to take the FAST or other EOC tests during their administration dates. *Some examples of a National Norm-Referenced Test are the Stanford Achievement (Stanford 10), IOWA Assessment (ITBS) and TerraNova.*

Once school ends for 2022-23 all students must submit a copy of their academic records whether in Private or Home School. This should include final grades for all core subject areas as well as any elective classes taken.

If your student took classes through Virtual School such as FLVS or BVS, they should be able to give you an official transcript for all classes taken with them.
