- o Practice dates and times will be discussed after tryouts; 2 or 3 a week (Mon Sat)
- Other team bonding activities will be held throughout the summer

Payments

- o Second payment of \$50 is due July 18, 2020
- o Final payment/balance on account is due July 24, 2020
- o If for any reason a cheerleader quits or is removed from the team at any time; there is NO REFUND.

CENTRAL MIDDLE SCHOOL CHEERLEADING GUIDELINES

TRYOUT PROCEDURES FOR PARTICIPANTS

- The Participant must have and keep a cumulative 2.0 G.P.A. No failing grades.
- Satisfactory school disciplinary record. No referrals. No suspensions.
- The Participant must have turned in *completed* physical and parent consent forms ECG, EL2, EL3, RTA
- The items below will be used to select the new squad:
 - 1. Attitude and Participation at clinic and tryouts.
 - 2. Appearance/Spirit at clinic and tryouts.
 - 3. Skills Performance: Dance, Cheer, Jumps.
 - 4. Grades, Attendance, All Teacher recommendations.
 - 5. Tumbling (optional) at the tryout.

Please wear comfortable shorts, sneakers, and t-shirt (No other cheerleading/dance team/high school clothing. No CMS cheerleading outfits from previous years). Spirit dress (i.e. decorated t-shirts, bows) is always welcome. The Participant must dress as if he/she would for cheerleading practice. Hair should remain out of the face. NO denim shorts, ABSOLUTELY NO JEWELRY! NO GUM! Bring WATER! All drink and food must remain in gym lobby.

PROCEDURES TO REMAIN ON THE SQUAD

- Maintain a 2.0 GPA the entire year.
- No failing grades on any report card.
- Remain a respectable role model with coaches, teachers, administration, and peers.
- Keep a satisfactory discipline record.
- Be present at ALL cheer practices/activities unless excused by the coach.
- Absence at practice may result in being benched.
- Excessive tardy and/or attendance issues may result in removal from the squad.
- Homework & school projects are NOT excused absences-time management is critical!!
- Extra-Curricular Activities: Cheerleaders may participate in other <u>school-sponsored</u> sports & organizations, but time should be split fairly, and scheduled in advance with both Sponsors/Coaches. May be excluded from certain performances if not at practice. <u>All-Star/Studio cheer/dance teams</u> are **NOT** excused absences!

GRADES

- A "C" average must be maintained in all academic subjects each grading period. The state requires a cumulative 2.0 to be eligible to cheer.
- If a cheerleader receives an F on an interim/report card, the cheerleader will be benched until that grade is brought up.
- If a cheerleader receives anything below a satisfactory in behavior on any interim or report card, the cheerleader will be benched for a period of two weeks or until behavior improves in that particular class.

ATTITUDE/BEHAVIOR

- A squad member should promote good sportsmanship at all times. There will be no sarcastic remarks, foul language, or disrespectful words toward other cheerleading members, cheerleading coaches, CMS faculty, or anyone. This will not be tolerated and can result in disciplinary actions from the coach and depending on the severity of the actions, administration could potentially be involved. Possible removal from the team.

 **REMEMBER: It's not always WHAT you say; it's HOW you say it.
- <u>No Complaining</u>. If the cheerleader wants to express his/her feelings, they must do it after practice one on one with the Coach. Complaining (huffing and puffing/rolling eyes/talking under their breath) amongst the team will not be tolerated and result in being sent home and demerits given.
- Cheerleaders are <u>role models</u>. Cheerleaders are expected to set a good example for their fellow students.
- If a cheerleader receives a referral-the cheerleader will be benched 1 week, the 2nd referral-benched for 2 weeks and the 3rd referral-the cheerleader may be dismissed from the squad.
- If a cheerleader receives a referral that results in OSS (due to fighting, using profanity, etc.) the cheerleader may be dismissed from the squad.
- There will be NO cliques! These types of groups hurt the togetherness of the team.
- All school rules must be followed as well as <u>dress code</u>. If an outfit is questionable; don't wear it!
- Public displays of affection in or out of uniform will not be tolerated and can result in disciplinary actions/demerits from the coach.
- Absolutely no bullying on or offline.
- Social Media will be monitored. Bullying, foul language, and questionable posts/pictures
 will not be tolerated and will result in demerits and disciplinary action from the coach
 and depending on the severity of the actions, administration could potentially be
 involved.
- If the cheerleader is at school, he/she is expected to be at practice/game that day.
- The cheerleader must be at school to participate in cheerleading activities.
- If the cheerleader is going to be late, miss practice, he/she's parent must communicate with the coach, **not** another cheerleader.
- A Demerit system will be in effect beginning the first meeting/practice. Demerits are to be discussed with Cheerleader, Parents and Coaches, **only**. Demerits are <u>not</u> to be discussed with any other team member or any other parent. If this occurs a Cheerleader may be dismissed from the team. Coaches are the <u>only</u> ones who will initiate demerits.

ATTIRE/APPEARANCE

- <u>Practice attire</u>: Must be worn the correct way (no rolling up/down of shorts, no tying up of shirts, midriff showing will not be allowed).
- Each cheerleader must be dressed and ready in *correct practice wear, sports bra, spank, shoes and bow* at the beginning of each practice; if not, will result in an unexcused tardy

- and demerits. For the safety of all cheerleaders, sneakers/cheerleading shoes must be worn at practice or the cheerleader will not participate.
- Jewelry is not permitted during practice, games, or performances. This includes: rings (of any kind), necklaces, and earnings.
- Cheerleaders must wear their hair as requested by the coach for practices and games. All hair must remain out of their face.
- Any nail polish must be subtle, nothing crazy/attention grabbers or excessive length.
- No unnatural hair color (pink, blue, purple, etc.)

GAMES

- Basketball games can begin the last week of August and end the first week of October. This includes all of September. Games are every Tuesday and Thursday. There are 10 games. Possible playoff for 2 additional weeks. All games start at 5:00. GAMES ARE ABSOLUTELY MANDATORY!
- Cheerleaders will remain after school for both home and away games. Cheerleaders will
 ride the bus to away games with Girls Basketball team. Some games would require
 cheerleader to leave before last period of school day. Cheerleader is responsible in
 making up any missed schoolwork.
- If a cheerleader would like to return home after the game with a parent, **WRITTEN NOTICE** must be given to the Coach.
- Parents must be on time to pick up your child after Home and Away games.
- Cheerleader must attend the entire game, including pre-game, set-up, or any other requirements for that performance. Cheerleaders will clean up their area before leaving home & away games.
- Water and restroom breaks during games/performances should be taken together and all members should return together to the appropriate place within the allotted time.

UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT

- <u>Game attire</u>: Must wear appropriate uniform established prior to the game/performance. Uniform designated for a game/performance must be **CLEAN & NEAT** in appearance. Clean shoes & socks. Bows are considered part of the uniform.
- Alterations may not be made to the uniform without permission from the Coach.
- Squad members are responsible for the care, cleaning and repair of uniforms and equipment. When any loaned equipment is returned to the coach, it must be clean and in good condition. If any of the equipment is damaged, it is the cheerleader's responsibility to notify Coach in order for it to be replaced or fixed.
- Any props, such as, poms, megaphones and/or signs, are to be used **ONLY** by the CMS cheerleaders.

MONEY MAKING ACTIVITIES

• All squad members must participate in squad fundraising activities. Fundraisers are mandatory. Fundraisers are to benefit the entire team's costs and activities for the year.

PARENTS AND CHEERLEADERS

- If a parent or cheerleader has a question or concern about the program, it is best to approach the coach first by phone or email. Please do not attempt to approach the coach before a game, after a game, or before/after practice. This takes time away from the team.
- The parent or cheerleader must email and/or text the coach and set up appropriate appointment time for both the coach and the parent.
- Both the Principal and Athletic Director have given our coaching staff their full support. The most reliable, accurate information **is first acquired** directly from the Cheer Coach.

PARENT AND CHEERLEADER CONSENT LETTER

Dear Parents,

Your child is interested in becoming a member of the Central Middle School Cheerleading Squad for the 2020-2021 season. If your child is selected to be a cheerleader, there are specific responsibilities and obligations that you and your child must assume in order to qualify and remain part of the squad.

After reading the attached cheerleading guidelines and fully understanding the rules and regulations which govern the cheerleaders, and after your child has complete understanding of her/his responsibilities, please sign and have your child sign and return this packet to Central Middle School no later than June 26, 2020.

The estimated cost for each cheerleader is \$400-\$600 (uniform, shoes, practice wear, poms, bows, choreography, camps). Warm ups (jacket/pants) will be available for an additional cost.

There will be 1 Choreography sessions in the summer; TBA; which are approximately \$50 each.

Participation in all fundraisers is mandatory. Fundraisers will be discussed at the parent/cheerleader meeting.

First payment approximately \$250 is due July 10, Second payment of \$50 is due July 16, Final balance/payment is due July 24. New practice wear and uniform will need to be purchased, as well as, new shoes, performance bow, and poms for all cheerleaders, new and returning. Costs will be discussed on an individual basis.

If for any reason a cheerleader quits or is removed from the team, there is **NO REFUND**.

Practices are 2-3 times a week, including Saturdays, **ALL** summer. Beginning May. Practices & Camps & Fundraisers are ALL mandatory. We understand that summer vacations are planned. We always do our best to work with scheduled vacations.
