****Important Information Regarding Testing****

Dear Edgewood Students and Families,

We know that there is a lot of information being discussed regarding the Emergency Order as well as information pertaining to School Year 2021-2022. We understand there are many questions, and we will do our every best to answer your questions. At this time, the District is currently working through and finalizing many details, but here is some preliminary information:

Full Practice Test

Monday, April 26th from 8:30 am – 12:30 pm in the Cafeteria.

EMERGENCY ORDER – EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

State EOC exams: Algebra 1 and ELA 2 FSA remain graduation requirements however school districts are authorized to determine promotion and final course grades in EOC courses based solely on the student performance in instances where the student does not have an EOC score or if the EOC score has an adverse effect on the course grade. This authorization only applies to the successful completion of EOC courses during the 2020-2021 school year.

Bright Futures: Volunteer hours are suspended for 2021 graduating seniors only. Edgewood is required to collect and submit documentation reporting compliance with the required number of volunteer service hours for scholarship eligibility. It is expected that every senior student will have 1) the student completed the service hours; 2) had planned for, and intended to, complete the service hours prior to the student's high school graduation, but was unable to do so because the COVID-19 pandemic created a lack of access to volunteer opportunities; or 3) due to health concerns, the student fell short of the volunteer service hours.

Students who have not completed their hours need to submit documentation based on numbers 2 and 3. This documentation will be considered as evidence that a student has completed the required number of volunteer hours for scholarship eligibility. Because we have so few students who have not completed the required volunteer service hours, we will reach out to any seniors who have not completed their volunteer hours.

Extension of testing deadline: Students graduating in the 2020-2021 academic year can earn at least the required minimum SAT and ACT scores as specified for each Bright Futures Scholarship award level no later than December 1, 2021. Sections of the SAT and ACT from different test dates may continue to be used to meet the test criteria through December 1, 2021 but test types cannot be mixed between ACT and SAT.

PRELIMINARY 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR INFORMATION:

- First Day of School for students is August 10th – published on the board approved calendar
- We are planning for secondary schools to return to a 7 period day vs. block scheduling pending board and community input and approval
- We will be fully brick and mortar and not providing the synchronized eLearning platform
- Students who wish to have virtual options may do so through Brevard Virtual School
- Dual Enrollment will continue as an option for students

- We are anticipating a full return to all activities with relevant safety precautions based on prevailing COVID conditions at that time
- The mask mandate as it pertains to next school year is currently being discussed. More information will be provided once it is available

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the computer-based Grade 7, 8, 9, or 10 ELA Reading, Grade 7 Mathematics and/or Algebra 1/Biology 1/Civics/Geometry/U.S. History End-of-Course (EOC) assessment(s) in May of 2021. (Students should check their Google Classrooms for specific dates, times, and locations.)

Per the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), no remote administrations are available for any statewide summative assessments.

The test/s your student is scheduled for are designed to be taken over two days (one session per day) to prevent testing fatigue (except for ELA Writing and the Biology 1, Civics, and U.S. History EOCs, which are one session). However, in an effort to reduce the number of in-person testing days for your student, districts and schools have been granted permission by FDOE to offer the option of administering two sessions in the same day, with a short break in between sessions. If you **do not** wish for your student to use this option, please contact Mrs. Poley. **All math assessments at Edgewood will still be given on two separate days unless you have to test in the makeup testing window.**

Your student should have had an opportunity to participate in a practice test to become familiar with the computer-based testing platform, item types, and response formats he or she will see on the assessment(s). If you or your student would like to review the computer-based practice test at home, the practice tests and answer keys are available at <https://FSAssessments.org/students-and-families/practice-tests/computer-based-materials/index.shtml>.

Please review the following policies with your student before testing:

- **Electronic Devices**—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing **or** during breaks (e.g., restroom), **even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them**. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated. Cell phones will need to be turned off completely and put in a secure area during testing. Students may access them when they have completed the test and have left the testing room to call for transportation if they are e-Learners.
- **Calculator Policy**— For Grade 7 Mathematics, **approved and provided calculators may be used during Sessions 2 and 3 only**. For Algebra 1 and Geometry EOC assessments, **approved and provided calculators may be used during Session 2 only**. If students have handheld calculators during Session 1, their tests will be invalidated. For Biology 1 EOC, a handheld four-function calculator will be provided by the school.
- **Testing Rules Acknowledgment**—All tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to

students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking a checkbox beside the statement in the secure browser.

- **Discussing Test Content after Testing**—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they affirm the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, students may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items, passages, and prompts) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites. Please make sure your student understands this policy prior to testing and remind them that “discussing” test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. **While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.**
- **Working Independently**—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, FDOE employs Caveon Test Security to analyze student test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Students’ tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.
- **Leaving Campus**—If your student leaves campus before completing a test session (e.g., for lunch, an appointment, illness), he or she **will not** be allowed to return to that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- **Testing Accommodations**—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL, please contact the school to discuss the testing accommodations that will be provided for your student.

****Important Information Regarding Student Check Out****

BPS has clarified their check out policy. **Only legal guardians can check out a student for non-emergency reasons.** All persons listed as an “emergency contact” will only be called and allowed to pick-up the student during an emergency. Summer Fine Arts

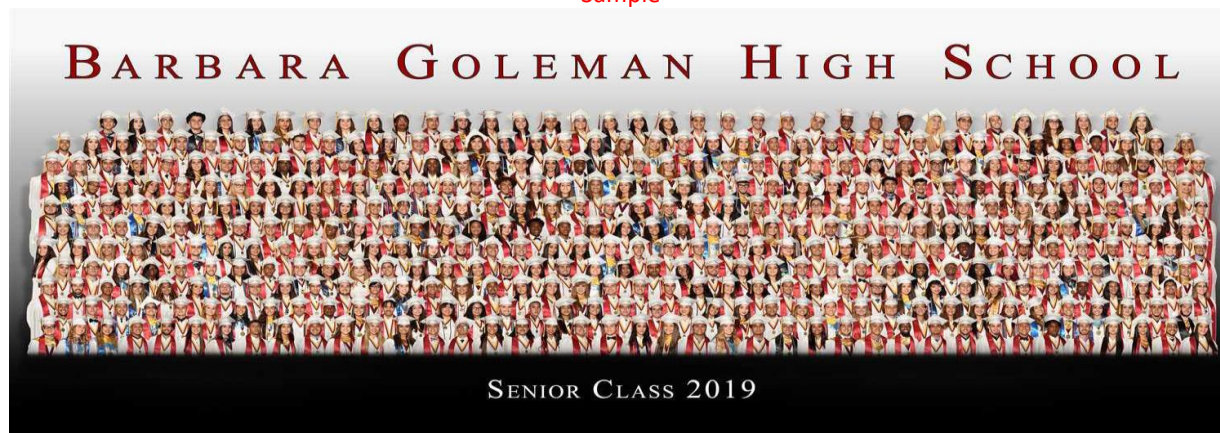

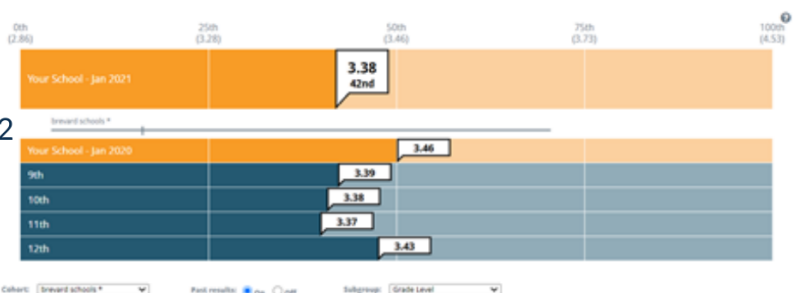

Although meals have been free for all students during the pandemic, it is still important to submit a Free and Reduced Price Meal Application for the 2020-21 school year.

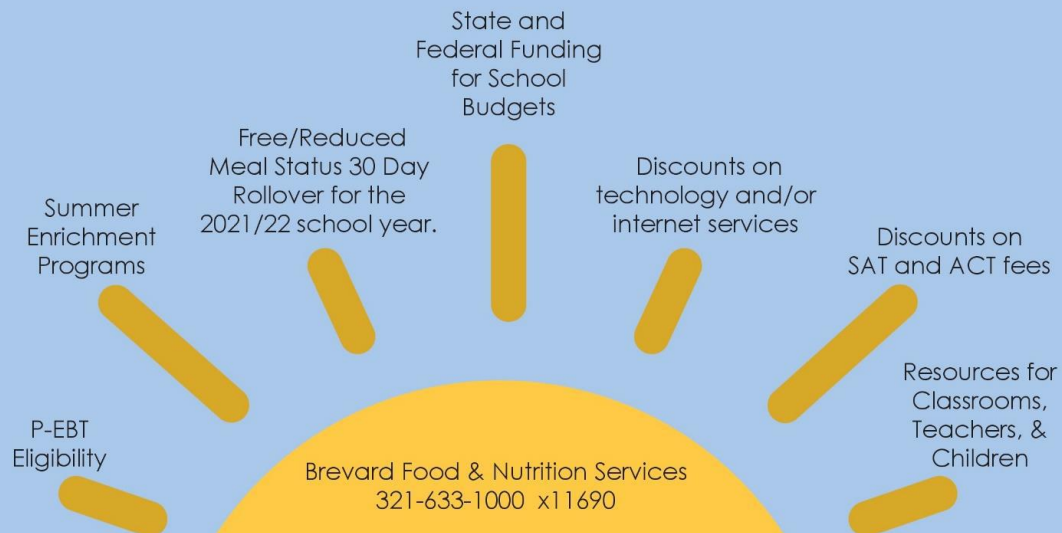
