Congratulations to all students competing in the Intracoastal Science and Engineering Fair! Edgewood Science Research students placed very well earning a total of \$401,670.00 in money, grants and scholarships. High school students earned a total 41 award placements and middle school students earned a total of 32 award placements. We are so proud of the 110 students who competed in Science Fair and so many of our students are moving on to future competitions!

Several of our students competed in All-County Band, Chorus and Orchestra. They have worked tirelessly and the performances were nothing short of outstanding. Our Edgewood musicians are now gearing up for their Musical Performance Assessments [MPA] – we can hear them practice in the courtyards during Power Hour.

A busy winter season is wrapping up. Boys basketball logged double-digit wins, and girls basketball finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the north Cape Coast Conference. Boys soccer took a great record into the post-season and, despite falling in the district semifinals, advanced to regionals based on their MaxPreps ranking. The girls soccer team continued it's amazing season, staying undefeated and capturing the Cape Coast Conference championship, our district championship, and advancing into regionals, where they won their regional quarterfinal.
