

NEWS FROM THE CLINIC



Vitamin D! It has so many health benefits yet is often overlooked. Many people do not know they are lacking this wonderful vitamin. It boosts the immune system, helps build strong bones, has anti-inflammatory and antioxidant properties, supports muscle and brain function, and has neuroprotective properties. Whew, that is a lot of benefits in one little vitamin. One of the biggest risks of not having enough vitamin D is weak bones contributing to Rickets and/or Osteoporosis as we age. There are few foods that have enough vitamin D in them to give our bodies what it needs. Fortified milk and fortified cereal help as well as fatty fish like salmon. Being in the sun does convert chemicals in our skin into vitamin D, but with too much sun comes the risk of skin cancer. If you don't know your vitamin D levels it would be a great topic to discuss with your physician. He or she can guide you on proper nutrition for your health status and whether supplementation would be beneficial. If you choose to see your physician, it would be helpful to have a list of your medications. Certain drugs do interact with vitamin D supplements and in an effort to be healthier we don't want to create a different problem.

ACADEMIC STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

From Thursday 3/31 through Saturday 4/2, four Edgewood students competed as members of the Brevard County all-star academic team at the state championship. Phoenix Boggs, Nikhil Iyer, and Jon Wang played as 3 of the 6 competitors on the team, and Abbie Shepard filled a managerial role. On Thursday, they finished 1st in their room by a landslide margin, earning themselves a direct path to the semifinals without having to play any matches on Friday. On Saturday morning, they competed in the semifinals, finishing second in their room to Polk County, who had incredibly high numbers on math and science questions. Since the top 3 teams in each semifinal advance, this earned them a place in the finals. In the finals, they played the best match of their careers, avenging their 2nd place finish to Polk as well as toppling the top literature and history team at the competition: Manatee County. The scores in the final were as follows:

Seminole: 157

Overall, Nikhil had a great showing, answering the 4th most questions on Team Brevard. Phoenix finished 2nd in overall points. Jon had the greatest performance, not only on Team Brevard, but out of everyone else in Division 1 play, earning him a spot-on Team Florida as one of the top scholars in the state. The team members have won championship rings and a \$500 scholarship as a result of their accomplishment, and Jon earned an additional \$1000 as a member of Team Florida.
