Registration for all students will be held on August 3, between the hours of 8:00am and 6:00pm. Students will receive their schedules, remit any outstanding obligations and fines as well as obtain their hall lock (if needed) and pay the activity/planner/PE uniform fees. Students who drive to school may also purchase campus parking permits. **If you cannot attend Registration on August 3, please contact the Front Office.**

WHAT TO BRING TO REGISTRATION?

If you do not come to registration with your student, **please make sure he/she comes with the needed information:**

● **\$27.00 which includes:**

- \$5.00 for your lock for hall-locker. If you were an Edgewood student last year and have an Edgewood purchased lock, you may use the same lock
 - \$2.00 for PE Lock rental – if you have PE
 - \$5.00 for Activity fee/Planner
 - \$15.00 for PE Uniform – **if needed** (\$7.50 PE Shorts/\$7.50 PE Shirt)
- **Fees and Fines:** If you ended last year owing any fees or fines, now is the time to pay your obligations

● **Immunizations:** Incoming NEW (Previously enrolled as private, home education, or from out of Brevard County) and 7th grade students – Your immunization records were due by JULY 1. If you have not turned them in, please remember you will not be able to start the registration process if your immunizations are not current! Please bring these records to school before registration so there won't be any delay.

● **Emergency Information – pick up a change form if needed:** It is important that we have parent's names, place of work, change of telephones, and emergency contact information. The person listed in Case of Emergency, will be contacted when we are unable to locate a parent or guardian and **must have authorization** to check your student out of school in case of illness or doctor appointment. List any medical problems or special conditions that may affect your student's health.

STUDENT MUST HAVE LEARNER'S PERMIT BEFORE THE 1ST DAY OF CLASS

If the instructor feels that your student is an able driver at the end of the semester, he will award your student with a waiver for their driver's license. If he feels they need more time driving, he can elect to not give your student a waiver and then they will have to take the driving portion of their test at the DMV. Whether or not they receive a waiver will not affect their grade in the class.

The students will have 30 hours of classroom instruction and 6 hours of range driving and will receive .5 credit at the end of the semester.

Student will need to bring their Learner's Permit with them each day to class.

\$80 payment must be made on the first day of class.

All programs are subject to change (up to and including cancellations) depending on decisions made by local and state authorities. Seats for our driver's education program are available on a first-come, first-serve basis with a limit of 30 students. Students will be added to a wait list after all seats are filled.




CLASS OF 2023 – SENIOR PARENT NIGHT

*** BPS DISTRICT LAPTOP POLICY FOR NEW AND RETURNING STUDENTS ***

Beginning with the 2022/2023 school year Edgewood will move to a one-to-one laptop model for all students. Students will be issued a school laptop to use for all course work. Students will transport their Brevard Public Schools (BPS) issued laptop to and from school. Due to security issues and Brevard Public Schools directive, personal laptops will no longer be used on campus. Edgewood Jr./Sr. High School will distribute a computer and power supply to each student during the first week of school. Students and parents will sign for the issued laptop. Laptops will be returned at the end of the school year. Laptops are expected to return in the condition received in August. Any preventable, or deliberate, damages will be recorded and charged accordingly.

Common damages are:

- Missing keys
- Cracked screens due to misuse or mishandling
- Lost or damaged power supplies
- Damaged USB, USB-C- and power sockets
- Missing screws

Early Admit students will be issued a laptop upon request.

Students are required to purchase their own headset for use as directed in class. Edgewood Jr./Sr. High School recommends a USB headset that does not require driver installation. The below list are some recommendations:

Third line is called Sombrero's.

This will have all Ala-cart food items, grab and go.

- * **Lunch:** Elementary \$2.10; Secondary \$2.50; Reduced \$.40

Please note: The USDA COVID Meal Flexibility Waiver which permitted all students to eat free regardless of status during the 2021-22 school year expired on May 26, 2022.

INCOMING 7TH GRADE and NEW STUDENTS

Students entering seventh grade and new students to Brevard Public Schools are required by the State of Florida to have completed their immunizations. *New students to Brevard Public Schools* are required to have a current physical. School Physical Exams may be obtained at your private provider's office or an walk-in clinic.

All 7th Grade students are required to have a TDAP Booster. This vaccine is free at your local Brevard County Health Department, or you can obtain them from your physician. Click on the following link for more information.

BPS does not allow students that do not have all their immunizations/physicals to complete the registration process in August. Failure to submit proof may delay your student from being able to pick up their schedule during fall registration on August 3, 2022.

Immunizations and proof of physical (new to BPS students only) were due to the guidance office by JULY 1, 2022.

Parent Volunteers at Edgewood

The Volunteer Program is a vital part of our school. School of Choice families are expected to donate 20 hours PER family to Edgewood. Unlike the elementary level, seldom will our volunteers be needed in the classrooms, so don't panic if you're one of our working parents. Between sports, clubs, and activities there will be many opportunities for you to fulfill this small obligation. We need parents on field trips, fundraisers, school grounds beautification, mentoring, parent committees, School Advisory Council, PTO, special events, etc.

Individuals wanting to volunteer must become a REGISTERED volunteer by completing an online application and fingerprinting with the Office of District and School Security. There is an annual renewal fee of \$8.00. Registered Volunteers will be notified via the email associated with their application 60 days and 30 days prior to their renewal.

Someone will be available during registration to provide information and answer questions. Parents must be registered volunteers to volunteer time at the school. There are many ways to complete the hours, but **all parent hours must benefit Edgewood.** Parent volunteer hours through the A+ Thrift Store are a great way to earn volunteer hours. They support the schools by donating their profits back to the schools.

Students must complete 25 hours of service-learning time anywhere in the community. Students in grades 10-12 are expected to have met the 25 hours requirement in each of their high school years to align with Bright Futures expectations. This requirement is also a part of students earning the Diploma of Distinction upon graduating from Edgewood. For reference, current seniors should have completed 75 or more hours, juniors 50 or more hours, and sophomores 25 or more hours. This will ensure they are on pace to meet the minimum requirements of earning 100 hours in high school.

Remember, parents and students sign the Parent and Student Contract agreeing to meet this obligation each year.

Volunteer Q & A's

Why do I have to become a BPS approved volunteer?

To ensure the safety of our students and security of our school campuses, all Brevard Public Schools volunteers are subjected to a criminal background check prior to approval.

How can I find out if my volunteer status is still valid?

You can check your volunteer status through your schools volunteer coordinator. Each school has a volunteer coordinator who has the ability to check the District's visitor/volunteer management system and determine if your volunteer status is still valid. If your volunteer status has expired please visit the District's website for renewal instructions.

How many years is a Registered Volunteer valid for?

Your registered volunteer status is good for one year. We will retain your fingerprints digitally and electronically resubmit your fingerprints to the Florida Department of Law enforcement for a fee of \$8.00. Registered volunteers will be notified via the email account associated with their application 60 days and 30 days prior to their renewal. You will not need to return to our office to be fingerprinted yearly.

Why do Volunteers need to be fingerprinted?

Registered Volunteers MUST be fingerprinted. The Level II background check that is conducted via the fingerprint submission to the FBI national database gives us the ability to know definitely who is in direct contact with our students.

What is a Level II background screening?

The FBI, Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) and Florida Department of Education (FDOE) all use state-of-the-art electronic equipment to process fingerprints through the Florida Crime Information Center (FCIC) and the National Crime Information Center (NCIC). A level II background screening will provide the District with a summary of any criminal arrest, as well as the case disposition.

I have a "security clearance" for my job. Can those fingerprints be utilized for this purpose?

The State of Florida does not have a shared database that would allow us to access another agencies employee fingerprints. The systems utilized by the federal government, contractors of the United States government and private companies are disparate systems and communicate and store data in different manners.

What is a Registered Volunteer able to do?

Registered Volunteers are able to work in the classroom and around the schools. They will also be able to work one on one with students and attend in county and out of county field trips.

I have a previous arrest history that I do not want anyone to see. Who has access to the information that I provide to be fingerprinted?

The information we receive from the FBI is highly confidential and pursuant to Florida law it may only be shared with appropriate personnel relating to the volunteer process.

In order to be fingerprinted, what do I bring to the Office of District and School Security?

A valid driver license or state identification card and a credit or debit card for payment.
