


Mrs. Scherff, ESE Teacher

Second Grade

Welcome to Second Grade! At the start of school, we will be focusing on creating and building our classroom community. We can't wait to get to know our students and for our students to get to know each other as we develop our school families. We will create with our students our classroom and online policies and procedures. We plan to dive into online learning, getting to know all of the various platforms available to us. We are learning right along with our students and look forward to this new and exciting journey. We will be reading books focused on classroom community, friendships, and school wide expectations. As we build up our students love for reading, we will be doing some initial assessments to establish students' reading levels. In math, we will focus on fluently adding and subtracting up to 20, and in science we will explore the scientific method. The second grade team is so excited to begin this school year!

Fifth Grade

5th grade is ready to jump into some learning! In all content areas, our primary focus will be on establishing a healthy, academic, growth mindset, because that is what sets the tone for everything else we learn through the year!

In ELA, students will be learning how to think critically about the texts they are reading as they compare and contrast the characters, settings, and themes within multiple texts. Students will be practicing how to think and analyze like a historian as we review Florida's history and geography in Social Studies.

Math with Mrs. Chieffe is all about growth mindset as students analyze the foundations of our number system and take a peek at how numbers are used for communication. Students will be challenged to think critically and to justify their positions regarding their math work. We will see that anyone can use a calculator for calculations, but it takes the creative and persistent passion of a true mathematician to really see the patterns and relationships that make math beautiful. This can only be accomplished through systematic practice and learning from mistakes. In math, mistakes are gold because they are the nucleation sites for deeper understanding and growth.

As students look into the nature of science with Mr. Comoletti, they will have the opportunity to think like scientists and be immersed in the scientific process as they dive deep into the question of what does a scientist do? How can we be scientists as we observe and record data and use that to inform and inspire our own explorations and discoveries? For the second year, this inquiry will involve interactive labs and an in-depth look at sea turtles and how scientists can make an impact on the environment.
