Admissions Policy Freedom 7 Elementary School of International Studies



Purpose of Admissions

- To identify families seeking an IB education at Freedom 7 Elementary School; one of three 100% Choice Schools in Brevard County.
- To provide equal education opportunity for families interested in attending Freedom 7 Elementary.
- To inform all potential families of expectation of attending Freedom 7 Elementary.
- To share the process for applying to a BPS Education Choice Opportunity.

Policies for Admission

- Must be a current resident of Brevard and upload 2 proofs of residency to the Family Dashboard before applying to Freedom 7.
- Must apply for admission through the BPS Choice Family Dashboard according to the application timeline.
- A behavioral/academic parent and student contract is required upon entry. This will be completed by the parent during the application process in a series of "Agree" questions thru the Family Dashboard.
- Students are accepted via lottery based on open seats at each grade level.
- Students admitted to Freedom 7 are notified by the BPS School of Choice Office via email.
- Families are required to formally accept their child's seat to reserve a spot for the upcoming year according to the published timeline.
- Families attend a required orientation meeting.
- Students not chosen during the lottery will be placed on a waitlist in the order their number came up. Freedom 7 will accept students off the waitlist as seats open
- Military and sibling preference are offered and part of the application process.
- Students could have their admission revoked if they do not attend school according to district policy or do not meet behavior expectations.
- Parent(s)/student(s) are expected to fulfill 20 community service hours annually.
