The PYP, or Primary Years Programme, is a program where students learn on their own agency. This is part of a wider program known as the IB, or International Baccalaureate. PYP is meant to be an international program, and as such it teaches us about the world and different cultures. !We learn about the world's many beauties and all who inhabit them. But with all the good that comes from the Earth there is also some bad. Pollution, war, poverty, destruction and so much more. This is where Exhibition comes in. During this, we learn about the Sustsainable Development Goals, a set of goals created by the UN to help the world overcome those problems and present our findings in fun ways like you will see later in the magazine.

One day, on October 24, 1945 in San Francisco, the United Nations was founded. To this day, it is an organization that helps the world with some of its problems, called global issues. All but two of the countries in the world are part of it. Eventually, in September of the year 2000, they put forward the MDGs, or the Millennium Development Goals. There were eight goals that each addressed a problem such as MDG 1, which was to get rid of global poverty and hunger. All eight were to be achieved by the year 2015. They were partially successful. In that same year, the U.N. developed a new set of goals, called the Sustainable Development Goals, and they had another 15 years to be completed, by 2030. They are 17 goals that fight certain issues like climate change, hunger, and poverty. That's where we come in. Now, see what we have all worked to do.

Our SDG is about finding information about what it's like to live in poverty, how it affects the world's population, and how we can help. The reason why we wanted to help inform people about poverty is because Tommy has experienced first hand poverty while visiting his family in Panama, and Timothy has also seen the effects of poverty in Colorado. Gia loves helping people in need, and August was inspired to learn more about poverty to help make a difference.

In our research we learned that overall there are 689 million living in poverty, which is 9.2 percent of the world's population. Some causes of poverty are losing money from having a lack of shelter, limited access to having things that they need such as water and food, unemployment, or having a physical disability so then they can't provide for themselves. On the flip side, some ways that we could help stop poverty are donating to charities, or helping people get their proper education so then they could get a job to work their way out of poverty.

Our group took action to spread awareness by posting art and messages all over on several different social media platforms. We invented a google site to show others about poverty. We put videos and activities that were appropriate for all ages on the site so that kids of any grade can watch the video and print the page. When one needs something but doesn't have the means to get it they may ask another for the means to get it or the thing they need but that person would say no and the cycle


repeat itself. Eventually, somebody will come along and help that person (hopefully) but why does that need to happen? Humanity as in all people should work together to make sure

The Exhibition process calls us to learn many things about our Sustainable Development Goal (SDG). Because there is so much, we can narrow it down to a few things. These are called our LOIs, or Lines Of Inquiry. We have 3 of them: an inquiry into the spread and development of treatments related to HIV/AIDS, Malaria, and Tuberculosis. An inquiry into the methods of proper sanitation and hygiene in areas with minimal resources and an inquiry into global health issues. All of these many things fit into one big central idea. That idea is that treatments of diseases proliferate in different ways through developing countries. We learned a lot about infections like HIV/AIDS, Malari, and Tuberculosis, We had questions, like what is the purpose of good bacteria, and we found answers. Good bacteria is mainly used to help you digest food, and up to 3% of you isn't actually you and is the good bacteria! We ended up learning a lot about the LOIs but also about some other things too, like what the definition of being fit is, the 3 types of health, how prosthetics work, and so much more! Learning about the LOIs not only helped us understand more about SDG #3, Good Health and Well-Being, but it also gave us an eye opening insight on the many problems the world faces and how the majority of people know so little about them. It's inspiring to look back at all we have learned and smile, knowing that with this, we can make a real difference in our future.


Our group has taken action to spread awareness to our communities about SDG 7. We hope that SDG 7 can be solved by 2030, with the help of the community.




THE THREE CLIMATEERS





After a bit of research, and lots of discussing and brainstorming, we came up with our central idea: Human impacts on ocean pollution.


