VPK registration will be held on April 18-28, 2022. The Early Learning Coalition is issuing Certificates of Eligibility for the 2022-2023 VPK program using the on-line registration site.

Kindergarten registration March 28-April 1st. Children entering kindergarten for the first time must comply with Florida Statue 1003.21 regarding age, which states a child must be five years old on or before September 1. All children who will be six

years old by February 1 of the school year, must attend school regularly during the entire school term.

Attention 6th Grade Parents

Florida State Law requires that all students receive a Tdap immunization booster BEFORE entering into the 7th grade. Because this immunization is not required for elementary students, it is not part of your child's school health records. Make an appointment now to get the booster. DON'T WAIT! Students without it will be turned away from Middle School registration.

Changing the way a student goes home

If you need to change the way your child goes home after school (bus, car, walk, After School Care or Daycare), **we must have this in writing for EACH child.** In accordance with the Jessica Lunsford Act, we cannot relay telephone messages to students regarding a change to their afternoon dismissal procedures. If the regular method of leaving school needs to be changed, parents must send a signed note to be given to the teacher. Only a written statement from the parent/guardian can be accepted as valid instructions. Include the following information in writing:

- Child's first & last name
- Teacher's name
- Date(s) this will be in effect
- First & last name of the person picking up (if applicable). Be sure this person brings their state issued driver's license or ID card and they MUST be listed on the child's registration form as authorized to pick up.
- Parent/Legal guardian's first & last name PRINTED
- Parent/Legal guardian's signature
- Date of the note

Thank you for your assistance in helping to keep our students safe.
