Do you like building things? Do you like working with a team? Do you like problem solving? Do you like coding? Join Freedom 7's Robotics Team!

Requirements of the team:

- 4th-6th grade
- Attend weekly practices and competitions. Practices will be held once a week on Fridays at 2:15 to 3:45 in the Science Lab beginning October 14, 2022.
- Work with a team and follow established behavioral Essential Agreements.
- · Complete weekly assignments.
- Competitions will take place on Saturdays (all day). Exact dates are unknown, but it will likely include one Saturday in November and one in either January/February.
- Parents will be responsible for providing transportation to competitions.
- \$60 Registration fee due at first meeting (covers First LEGO League annual fees like registration, local dues, and the challenge kit).

The team is limited to TEN students. Interested students must complete an application at https://forms.gle/2y2Preb7dDQGyxQy8. Team members will be selected by lottery. Team members should be able to attend all practices and competition. Please consider this when applying.

Does your child like solving problems? Do they enjoy thinking creatively? Then FPS might be for them! Future Problem Solving (FPS) has been an internationally recognized program for more than 40 years. Founded by the "father of creativity", Dr. E. Paul Torrance, FPS has provided a rich experience for children to think critically about a variety of topics through an articulated process.

Future problem solving is a competition whereby students are presented with a detailed situation in which they use a 6-step problem solving process to determine challenges, solutions, and an action plan, all set in the future. FPSers, as we are called, complete at the district, state, and international levels. Over the past several years, Freedom 7 competed at the international competition in June!
