



We are writing to inform you that all the below BASA program have been recommended for funding to operate a 21st CCLC program for the 2022-2023 program year. 21st CCLC funding is intended to establish or expand community learning centers that provide free, high-quality programming to students during non-school hours or during periods when school is not in session. 21st CCLC program in Florida are required to provide students with academic enrichment, personal enrichment, family member support, and a broad array of additional services.

The 21st CCLC programs are located at the below schools. The targeted students are students that attend these schools and student enrolled in private, non-profit schools in the geographic area served by the program site(s). All these targeted students are eligible to attend all aspects of the 21st CCLC equitable services, including our professional development opportunities.

As required by Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) we are obligated to provide eligible, non-profit, private schools with timely and meaningful consultation, the ability to present their views, the opportunity to have those views seriously considered, and the ability to discuss viable options for ensuring equitable participation of private school students, teachers, and other educational personnel.
