### School Registration has gone Digital!

The QR code posted is for Re-enrollment directions. Each family has a FOCUS account created, but some have yet to set it up. To obtain your unique Portal PIN, please contact our school office or administration. You can download the app on your phone or set it up online. All students and parents can have access to class updates, schoolwork, teacher directions, notifications, and gradebooks "live," 24/7. We are excited to welcome all new and returning Eagles to campus through the FOCUS Portal Enrollment process.

It is never too late to bring up those grades! Please check FOCUS regularly to provide gentle reminders to your children about getting any missing work turned in. If you have questions about grades or missing assignments, please reach out to the individual teachers; I know they would love to hear from you in supporting your student. All teachers, and counselors, are open to communication and will build opportunities as unique as your child to support their learning goals. Be mindful of requirements that we are also accountable for. Students must prove mastery of state standards as well as showing growth in academic skills that can secure their future success. 


# TRACKS FILM

## **Gradventure 2023**

Our students are some of the BEST in Brevard County. Please help them understand that their overall conduct will be on display while on the bus and at the theme parks. Any violations of the Code of Student Conduct or the rules below during the trip will result in students going to a holding area for the duration of the trip and a parent will be contacted for pick up from the park. Students will depart from school at 3:30 on Friday afternoon, May 5, 2023. We will be returning to CMS at approximately 1:30 Saturday morning.

Students may bring their cell phones on the trip. This will be an avenue of communication between the student and the chaperones. Students MUST wear comfortable fitting cargo/Bermuda length shorts or pants/capris and their 8th grade class t-shirt. (NO JEANS/DENIM material. NO leggings, tight fitting, or athletic shorts/pants. NO holes, rips, or shredding allowed. No hats or bandanas. No selfie sticks.). Students may NOT wear flip flops, sandals, slides, crocs, or backless shoes. String backpacks or small purses (under 8.5 x 5.5 inches) are allowed. It is recommended that students bring a Ziploc bag for their money/phone. Students must not have a suspension (ISS/OSS) for 2nd semester and students must be on track for promotion (you must be on track to pass your classes for the year).

Students may have no more than 7 unexcused absences 2nd semester prior to date of trip and no FA 1st semester. All students will be searched prior to getting on the bus.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN SHOULD STUDENTS BECOME INELIGIBLE TO ATTEND.
