Dear Parents,

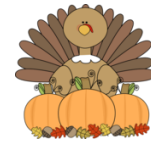

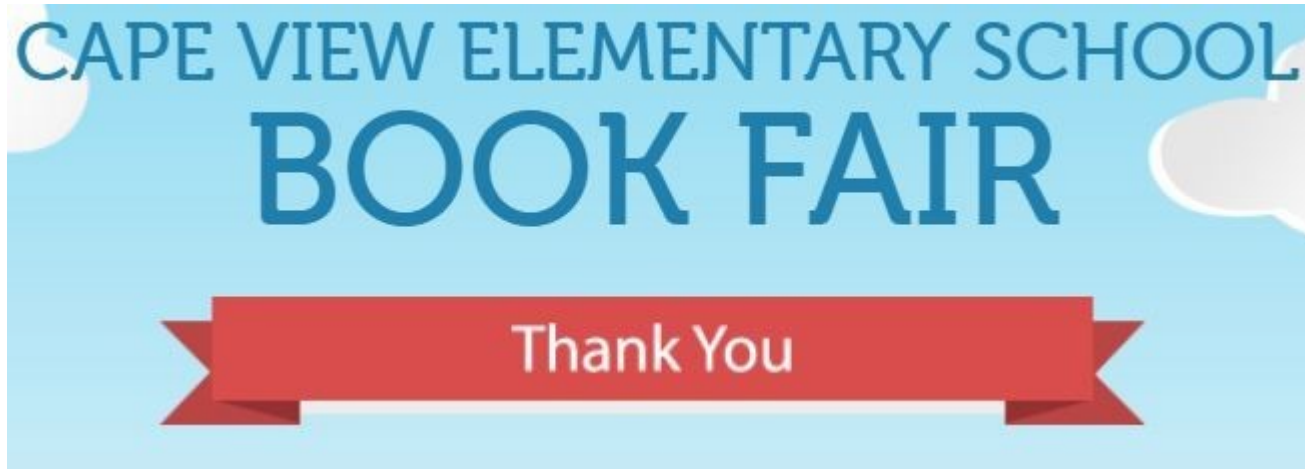

Cape View's Monthly School-Wide Writing

Did you know that writing can be a very challenging task for students? At Cape View, pre-kindergarten through sixth grade teachers lend their writing talent to improve student writing. This year, the ELA Curriculum team leads Cape View's school-wide writing efforts; each month your child is presented with a writing task and asked to perform his or her best. After each school-wide writing, teachers identify students who need extra support and conference one-on-one with those students. Teacher-student writing conferences help students develop confidence and effective writing strategies; teachers listen to student-writers read and respond to their written work, pose questions that help them clarify and articulate their ideas, and affirm the experiences and abilities they bring to their writing. Teachers work with student-writers at any stage of the writer's process, such as brainstorming, planning/organizing ideas, writing strategy selection, creating cohesive paragraphs, revising sentences, and citing evidence from text. The teacher-student writing conference also focuses on a specific writing element (focus, evidence, organization, elaboration and conventions) and theme with the goal of supporting student-writers as they develop more effective and productive writing strategies to apply to future writing tasks. Cape View teachers value student writers and the experiences they bring to their writing; teachers seek to provide a supportive environment for all writers to share and develop their writing craft. Kindergarten through sixth grade teachers maintain student writing portfolios; student portfolios allow teachers to see individual writing improvement over the six scheduled school-wide writing tasks. You may request to see your child's writing portfolio during any scheduled parent-teacher conference. Parents, get involved, and ask your child what he or she wrote about during this month's school-wide writing task!
