Friday, February 1st, the PTO will have a booth at Friday Fest as a part of fundraising efforts for the playground. Our PTO needs your help! We are currently writing a Matching Grant for two playgrounds: one age-appropriate for Pre-K and one for students ages 5-12. So far, the money PTO has raised is \$10,572 in addition to business partner contributions totaling more than \$39,500. If awarded the matching grant, we will be much closer to our goal of \$80,000. We have estimated the big kids' playground to be \$60,000 and the Pre-K playground to be \$20,000 - \$24,000. If you have some good ideas for fundraising, please contact our PTO presidents, Tina Adams and Janine Lowe.

Reminding you that February 8th will be our Valentine's Dance for grades 4-6 from 1:30-3:00 p.m. Please make sure to pick-up students on time after the dance or direct them to walk home. 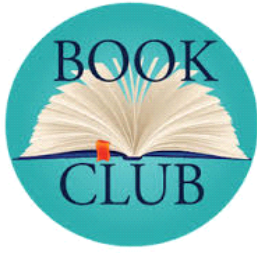

An important feature of SWVPBIS is the practice of engaging families as partners in schools. Families become recognized as important members of the school community, increasing the outcomes for all children.

A Working Definition of “Family Involvement”

- Awareness, Involvement & Support mapped to continuum of supports and defined locally.
- “Two-way street” - educators understand needs of families, families understand realities of the school day.
- Goal = “Partnerships” that lead to outcomes for children and youth.

Families and Shared decision-making:

- Families are equal partners in school decisions. This can be accomplished through PTO, SAC, and/or the PBIS committee.
- Include families in school decisions, developing leaders and representatives.
- We are interested in recruiting multiple family members for PBIS teams.
- Pair new families with veteran families (parent mentors).
- Offer short term participation on the PBIS team, with option to renew.
- Involve families in identifying incentives and celebrations.
