Minutes from 03/27/2023

Welcome

Sharon Forand opened the meeting at 3:30 p.m., welcoming members and guests. Deanna Smith reviewed the minutes from the previous SAC meeting held March 27, 2023. Drew White motioned to approve the minutes, and Christa Jackson seconded the motion.

School Events/Communication

Sharon Forand highlighted the following upcoming school events:

- Third quarter report cards will be published Wednesday, March 29, 2023.
- FAST Writing will take place on April 4, 2023. It is a field test for the state of Florida.
- Kindergarten Orientation is scheduled for April 12, 2023. Teachers have signed up to support different stations in the cafeteria, as well as tour rising kindergarten students around Enterprise.
- The last Enterprise Chorus Concert will be performed on April 20, 2023, in the cafeteria.
- Our next SAC meeting will occur April 17, 2023, in the media center.

School Operating Budget

Deanna Smith shared the following about the School Operating Budget:

- Enterprise has been allocated \$330,313 for the 2023-24 SY. This is based on student enrollment. Adjustments will be made if student enrollment is over/under its projection.

- Patty Freeman, Enterprise Bookkeeper, keeps a record of expenditures by maintaining a spreadsheet that breaks apart this total amount into separate fund categories. This indicates how money will be spent. **As the year progresses, there are times where funds may be moved across strings (i.e. fluctuate funds).**
- Chris Tabone asked if it is enough money to sustain the year. Deanna Smith shared the allotment is based on student FTE (Full Time Equivalency). She stated we have gained extra materials (e.g. based on ESSER funds/grant money), which we still utilize. We will continue to use this resource until they run out.
- Drew White inquired if any of this allocation goes to classroom updates or renovations. Deanna Smith replied that allocations for those needs are separate from this budget.

Youthtruth Survey Results

- Deanna Smith shared the results of the Youthtruth Survey provided on-line to students in grades 3-6. It is completely anonymous, and it is not guided. Students respond to questions about their experience at Enterprise Elementary within the areas of: Engagement, Academic Challenge, Instructional Material, Culture, Belonging, and Relationships. Data reveals that we have stayed consistent with previous years even though most key measures show a slight down trend of one or two percent as compared to the 2021-22 SY. On average, scores from third grade and sixth grade seem to be the biggest factor for this. Nevertheless, we are at or above average of the scores across Brevard Public Schools.
- Deanna Smith stated it may be the way students perceive the questions (e.g. “Do you learn interesting things in school?”).
- This information will be shared with teachers during PLTs. Data gleaned from student, parent, and teacher/staff surveys will be reviewed and incorporated into the School Improvement Plan 23-24 SY.

The meeting concluded at 4:23 p.m. with Drew White motioning to adjourn the meeting.

Christa Jackson seconded the motion.
