I can't believe how quickly this school year has gone! Graduation is quickly approaching, and we want to make sure your student is prepared. Please continue checking FOCUS regularly for your student's current attendance and grades. Brevard County's 26-credit graduation requirement leaves no room for error, and every course counts toward graduation.

Please ensure that you have ordered cap, gown, and tassel, plus any other graduation items you would like, ASAP. If you have questions, please call Jostens in Melbourne at 242-2055. You must pay your balance in full to pick up the regalia.

All seniors should have completed the Florida Bright Futures initial application by going to www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/bf. We still have a few seniors who have not completed their initial application. This is required to be completed prior to graduation.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be completed for every student considering higher education. The application can be found by going to www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you need help completing the FAFSA, please contact Pedro Hernandez via e-mail at pedro.hernandez@fldoe.org or call with questions to 850-245-1821.

Eastern Florida State College (EFSC): If your student is planning on attending EFSC during summer, each student must see me to obtain a Graduation Pending letter, which is required before registering for summer courses. Each student interested in attending EFSC in the fall must have completed an application and all necessary enrollment steps as soon as possible. If you have questions about EFSC and/or registration, please contact EFSC admissions at 433-7300.

This school year is flying by, and the 4th quarter has begun! For our juniors, it's especially important for them to be prepared and on track to enter their upcoming senior year. The best way to stay informed of your student's progress is to continually check FOCUS on a regular basis. It's very important to monitor their attendance, and students need to make up any work they miss when they are out. If you would like to discuss your student's academic history and/or graduation status, please give me a call.

If your student has failed courses in the past and has not earned credit, it is important for him or her to attend credit retrieval and/or summer school. Students that have earned D's can also attend credit retrieval in order to improve their GPA. We offer credit retrieval through Brevard Adult Ed here on our campus on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3:30 to 5:30.

Many 11th graders have already taken or have scheduled to take the SAT and/or ACT. In March, all 11th grade students had the opportunity to take the SAT here at school free of charge. If you would like more information on these college admissions tests, you can check their websites at <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat> and <https://www.act.org>. Please keep in mind that students who receive free or reduced lunch may also obtain two waivers for each test.

Juniors also need to be aware that the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program has a mandatory community service hours requirement. The top scholarship requires 100 total hours. It's important to help your student build a resume by urging him or her to participate in sports, clubs, and activities. As soon as students start their senior year, they will be applying to colleges and completing applications for scholarships and they will be expected to show what they have accomplished during high school. Waiting until their senior year is too late so please encourage them start now, if they haven't already done so!

Class of 2021

Our 10th grade students took the writing portion of the English Language Arts Florida Standards Assessment (ELA FSA) in early April. The test has three sections which will be given over three days. English teachers have been preparing students all year for success. This is one of the two tests that must be passed in order to earn a high school diploma in the state of Florida (the other is the Algebra 1 EOC exam). Anyone who does not score at grade level (or does not take the ELA FSA) will be required to take an intensive language arts class junior year. Those students will retake the test each semester until they pass it.

Any student who failed a core course first semester (or last year) must retake the course in order to be promoted to 11th grade. We have before-school and after-school credit retrieval options. I will be contacting all parents and students who need to make up credits and registering them for one of the options.

Dual Enrollment: Did you know that Cocoa High has over 120 students taking college classes for free while they are in high school? Eastern Florida State College and Brevard County Schools offer dual enrollment opportunities for our students starting in 10th grade. Any student with a cumulative grade point average greater than 3.0 and who earns college ready-scores in reading and writing is eligible to take courses toward nearly any degree that EFSC offers.

There are some certificate programs at EFSC that are available for students with a 2.5 GPA that would be perfect for rising seniors who want to get a head start at EFSC. Contact me to discuss your student's options.

Welcome back to a new year in JROTC. This year, the program will continue focusing on improving cadet knowledge and leadership.
